Keys to Success in Washington State

- COFA communities make their voices heard
- Children's Alliance and COFA Alliance National Network support development of policies and advocacy efforts
- CAPAA listens to community concerns and personal stories
- CAPAA makes improving COFA health equity a legislative priority
- Rep. Santos and Sen. Saldaña sponsor legislation and Governor advances budget proposal

Review of Substitute Senate Bill 5683

- Creates a COFA premium assistance program
- Covers premium cost for a qualified health plan and the outof-pocket costs for the coverage provided by the plan
- Establishes eligibility criteria:
 - A Washington resident
 - COFA citizenship
 - Silver level plan enrollment
 - Income less than 133% FPL
 - Ineligible for federal and state medical assistance programs

Review of Substitute Senate Bill 5683

- Establishes criteria for disqualifying a participant
- Directs the Health Care Authority to establish processes to implement the program
- Education and outreach program to start by Sept. 1, 2018
- First open enrollment period begins Nov. 1, 2018
- A report to the Governor and Legislature to be provided by Dec. 31, 2019

Review of Substitute Senate Bill 5683

- Establishes an Advisory Committee to include representatives of COFA communities, insurers, and other stakeholders
- The committee will advise on the development, implementation, and operation of the COFA premium assistance program
- Transportation and travel expenses may be provided
